Garcitas Creek, June 24th, 1832.

Captain--I report to you that I have met a citizen who comes from Brazoria, and told me that the Americans 100 in number, left that phace on their way to Anahuac, that he was overtaken on San Bernardo Creek by Don Vicente Padilla, who was fleeing from the latter place, and informed him positively that the Americans had disarmed 100 men at the mouth of the Brazos, which I communicate to you before my departure for the Colorado, where I may hear of some more particulars.
