

**Words found on "Plan of Fort Velasco" document in Nacogdoches Archives (Map #6312)

*the original appears to be composed of four sections taped together, and now archived in a large clear plastic sleeve in the Map Drawer of the Nacogdoches Archives*

*it can also be found on Microfilm Roll 25 (without frame or page numbers), apparently copied from the taped-together original, but photocopied in overlapping quarter sections (quality not as good as link above).*

*The TSLAC index for Map #6312 indicates it was "probably copied from Document 4301", but examination of two documents with that number (and also 4501) in the Nacogdoches Archives appear NOT to be connected to the map, so the origin of the map remains unclear. Hypothesis: it is a rendering of the Republic Of Texas fort/battery of 1836-1842*

**upper left wall: North View 126 feet**

**upper right: Battery 18 by 18.**

**upper right wall: East Gate 30 feet**

**center: Guard Tent 12 by 15., Battery 21 by 21.**

**right wall: Front 142 feet, Front 142 feet Entrenchment 10 feet Wide 8. deep**

**lower left: Barrack Room 38. By 18., Office 7. by 8., Sally port 18 by 8.**

**lower left wall: N. W. ... Gate 26 feet**

**lower right: Officers Quarters 15 by 16., Picketts 12 feet high**

**bottom wall: South Line 162 feet**

**scale: Scale \*/10 to the foot., Fort Velasco**
